## REPORT ON RETAIL PRICE INDICES OF SELECTED CONSUMER ITEMS IN LAGOS AREA DURING THE SECOND QUARTER OF 1988

## 1. Movement of Price Indices

Retail prices of selected consumer items in the Lagos area continued to rise during the second quarter of 1988. The trend which began since the beginning of the year largely reflects the impact of the poor agricultural harvest in 1987, and the reflationary policy stance of the federal government.

The all item price index was 1223.1 (November $1975=$ 100), representing increases of 15.8 and 36.1 percent over the levels in the first quarter of 1988, and second quarter of 1987 respectively. All the indices contributed to the record increase in the aggregate index (See Table 1).

At 1407.8, the food index recorded increases of 16.1 and 44.0 percent vis-a-vis the levels in the preceding quarter and corresponding quarter of 1987. Despite the significant aggregate increase of 34.0 percent in the price index of staples over the level in the first quarter of 1988, mild increases of $6.9,4.2$ and 1.3 percent were recorded in the price indices of meat fish \& eggs, oils \& fats and vegetables fruits \& nuts respectively. The sharp increases noticed in the prices of white gari ( 126.6 percent) white grain maize ( 125.0 percent), coloured gari ( 177.2 percent), brown beans ( 83.8 percent) millet ( 79.7 percent) and yam flour (78.5 percent) over the levels a year ago, resulted mainly from the added demand of these produce by the industrial consumers.

The price index of beverages \& drinks was 823.9, representing increases of 8.6 and 32.5 percent over the first quarter of 1988 and the second quarter of 1987 respectively. Apart from the price of Tea which fell by 1.7 percent and that of soft drinks which stagnated relative to the preceding quarter, the increases in the prices of other items contributed to the increase of 8.6 per cent recorded over the level in the first quarter of 1988.

Other items in which significant price increases were also recorded include inter alia: tobacco ( 20.3 per cent), fuel and light ( 15.4 per cent), and clothing ( 6.0 per cent). While the price increase in fuel and light was influenced by increases in the prices of firewood and charcoal the celebration of various festivals in the quarter became the major contributory factor for the price increase in clothing.

## 2. Inter-Market Price Variations ${ }^{1}$

A mixed pattern of intermarket price variations was observed among the markets sampled in the Lagos area during the quarter. For instance, a medium-sized tuber of yam cost an average of $\$ 5.65$ at Alayabiagba market compared with $\$ 5.88$ and $\$ 6.75$ for the same weight at Aguda and Sangrouse markets.

Gari which has been quite scarce in recent times remained the cheapest at Oyingbo market where a 2.00 kg measure of either the yellow or white brand was sold for $\$ 6.38$. The price of this commodity remained highest at Itafaji where the unit of measure was sold for $\$ 8.00$. The 2.8 kg of imported rice was $\$ 15.75$ at Alayabiagba market while the same measure was sold for $\$ 17.00$ at Ereko market. However, the same measure was most expensive at Sangrouse market where it cost $\# 17.88$. A 2.5 kg measure of brown beans was sold for $\$ 21.50$ at Itafaji market, compared with
$\$ 16.50$ at Ereko and Tejuoso markets respectively. At Festac market, the 2.6 kg unit of yellow maize cost $\$ 7.00$ while the same unit of measurement attracted $\$ 9.00$ and $\$ 9.40$ respectively at Itafaji, and Ereko markets. The price of fresh beef was found to be expensive in all the markets surveyed. At Lawanson market, 1 kg cost 13.80 , while the measure was relatively cheaper at Sabo market, where it cost $\$ 13.00$. The price of a medium-sized life fowl attracted *19.00 at Ikeja market, compared with $\$ 14.50$ at Awolowo market. A bottle of palm oil - an equivalent of 72 cl . was sold for $\$ 3.20, \$ 2.70$ and $\$ 3.02$ respectively at Sabo, Jankara and Aguda markets. Also a 72 cl . of ground nut oil at Alayabiagba market cost $\$ 3.80$ while at Ereko and Itafaji markets the same measure cost $\ddagger 4.25$ and $\neq 4.50$ respectively. In the quarter under review, prices of green vegetables were basically uniform in all the markets sampled. Other items which maintained fairly uniform prices include crates of soft drinks, orange fruits and pawpaw.

Factors accounting for the intermarket price variations were market locations, accessibility, unabridled trading activities and the rising transportation costs, as a result of the sharp increases in the prices of motor vehicles and spare parts.
